Entertainment, arts and culture

There are many opportunities to enjoy arts, culture and entertainment in and around Oxford.

Visit **Modern Art Oxford** to see cutting-edge exhibitions featuring international contemporary artists. The gallery also organises live music events, discussions and film screenings.

The **New Theatre Oxford** hosts some of the biggest shows and well-known names, whilst alternative venues such as **The Old Fire Station** and **The North Wall** host more unusual performances.

Local celebrations — if you are in Oxford on the first of May, join in with the famous **May Morning** celebrations. In July, celebrate cultural diversity at the colourful **Cowley Road Carnival**.

Watch a film in one of **Oxford's cinemas**, with options including big multiplexes and small independent picture houses. The boutique **Curzon Cinema** is one of the city's most popular.



Sports and leisure

Local fitness centres — there are plenty of leisure centres located around Oxford, with facilities such as gyms, swimming pools, squash courts, and more. Full details can be found at the **Oxford City Council website**.

Oxford University Sport also has a host of great sports facilities for public use, which are accessible from both Kings' campuses.

Day trips and excursions

London — trains into central London run 7 days a week from Oxford's main station, providing unlimited access to the UK's buzzing capital city

Bicester Village — a trip to Bicester Village for some shopping provides an alternative to Oxford's cultural highlights. It is home to over 160 designer outlet shops.

Blenheim Palace — this impressive British stately home and UNESCO World Heritage Site is set in beautiful grounds and parkland, and is easily accessible from Oxford.



Explore Kings Oxford

Kings Oxford St. Michaels is where most of our English courses are taught. It is situated in a bright and colourful building in the city centre. There is also an annexe building with five extra classrooms around the corner on Alfred Street, and an art studio in King Edward Street, also located within 5 minutes' walk.

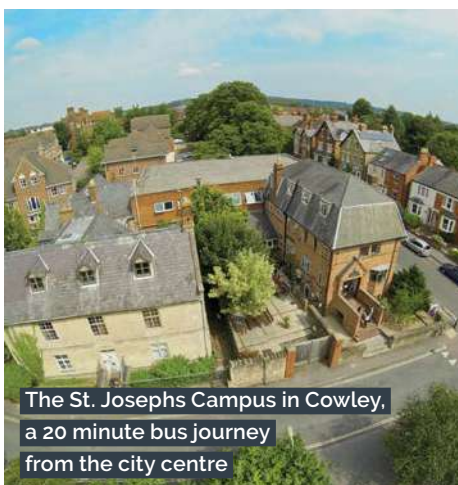

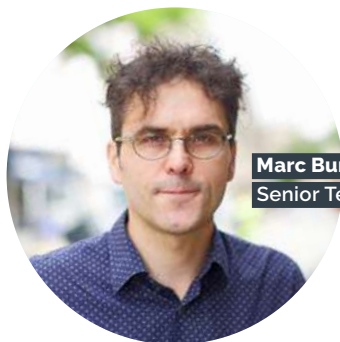

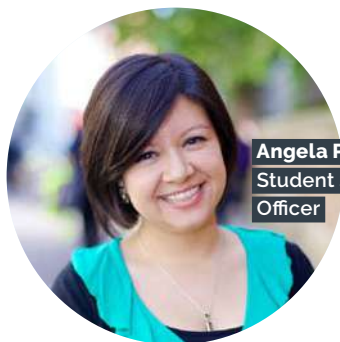

Our students get involved in all kinds of exciting fundraising activities and events throughout the year.

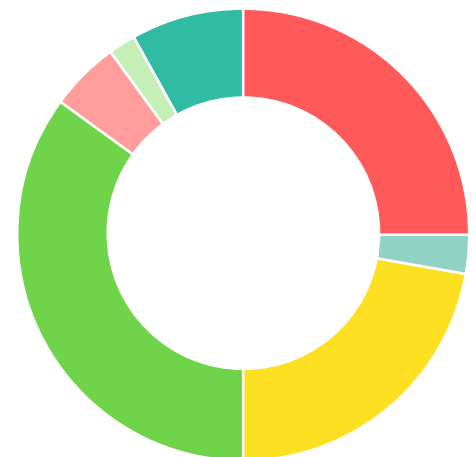
There are also opportunities to get involved in volunteering outside of Kings in the local community, which can teach you a wide range of skills, as well as being hugely rewarding
